BAPTISM AND MISSION FOR JESUS

Today we celebrate the baptism of Jesus in the Jordan River by St. John the Baptist. Jesus was 30 years old and about to begin his public ministry. For Jesus, baptism is a public affirmation of his identity as the beloved Son of God. The Holy Spirit manifests itself as a dove descending on Jesus and the voice of the Father is heard. The identity of Jesus is announced to the world. Now Jesus begins his public ministry with his proclamation of the Good News and the working of miracles.

BAPTISM AND MISSION FOR US

The Sacrament of Baptism for us is one of the seven sacraments of the Catholic Church and the first of the sacraments of initiation. By baptism, we become Christian. We are "claimed by Christ" and marked as his own. Each sacrament is an expression of God's love for us, but baptism is a special and unrepeatable experience. In baptism, God calls us his beloved son or his beloved daughter. Baptism gives us this identity from God, and he calls us 'beloved'.

Our identity is based on our relationship with God. Being a beloved daughter or son is **who we are**. We are called to faithfully live from this identity, and this determines our mission, which is **what we are meant to do**. We each have a role to play in God's work of salvation. It's a family project, involving all of God's sons and daughters.

WINTER PROJECTS AND PLANNING

January gives priests a brief reprieve between the busier Advent and Christmas seasons and the Lent and Easter seasons. During this time, we finish the year-end tasks from December, we look to plan the next round of maintenance projects, and we start the budget planning processes for the 2020-2021 fiscal/academic years. It also gives me a short time of R&R next week from Jan 13-17.

Each place has its own projects and expenses:

- St. John's in Petersburg is finishing work on a handicap accessible bathroom for the church. There's been work done on the boiler in the rectory and in Werner Hall.
- St. Boniface in Elgin is needing to fix gutter problems and water damage in the church. There's more info in the bulletin on this, with a challenge grant.
- St. Theresa's in Clearwater has been working on its lights. There's also a gutter on the north side that had an ice jam in the weather before Christmas.
- St. Bonaventure's in Raeville is scheduling water drainage work and placement of crushed concrete leading into the cemetery. They are also reviewing a bigger project of maintenance work needed for the frames of the stained glass windows.
- St. Peter's in Ewing is looking to get the church exterior repainted in the spring.
- Rural St. John's (Deloit) is needing to replace some gutter work on the church.

CONSECRATION TO THE HOLY FAMILY

We continue to prepare for the consecration to the Holy Family on Feb 1-2. During this time of preparation, we are invited to think about what we are consecrating. We are meant to bring our joys and hopes, our challenges and disappointments, our fears and apprehensions, and our love and care for each person in our family. Naming what those things are, reflecting and thinking through them, and describing those realities helps us be aware of what we are dedicating and offering to the Lord.



St. Boniface Church, Thanksgiving Day, November 28, 2019

What Happened?

- Winter Storm Dorothy visited us with 6+ inches of snow on Tuesday, November 26.
- Two days following Thanksgiving we received heavy rain.
- Water migrated into our church from what they call an ice dam, which is a ridge of ice that forms at the edge of the roof and prevents melting snow and rain from draining off the roof. It backs up behind the dam and causes leaks and damage to walls, etc.
- We were not the only ones experiencing this....other churches in our Archdiocese had damage as well, according to our representative from The Catholic Mutual Group.

Where did the damage occur?

 Water migrated into the same area that received damaged from the improper installation of the roof and coating of gutters in the past decade.

What do we do now?

• The Maintenance Committee sought professional advice, obtained a bid for the lining of the gutters with the same material the roof is made from, and presented that to the parish Finance Committee. We have contracted with Walker Brother Roofing for \$17,000 to do the work. If we get a stretch of good weather, they plan to make it their priority this winter, in hopes of stopping the damage that is occurring. Insurance will cover a portion of the cost to repair, paint and stencil the damaged wall once it dries out, but not the gutter lining itself.

How can you help? St. Boniface Finance Committee is asking for your help to offset this unfortunate, unexpected cost. This is an immediate expense to prevent further damage. A generous donor will match half the cost, if we can raise the rest!
