When I was younger and shorter and smaller, my dad would sometimes put me on his shoulders so that I could get a glimpse of what was going on... I wanted to really see what was happening!

THE TRANSFIGURATION AND SEEING JESUS

The Gospel passage (Mt 17:1 – 9) shows Jesus taking Peter, James, and John up a high mountain and being transfigured. 'Being transfigured' means that the divinity of Jesus shines through his humanity. In fact, it means that Jesus can be seen in the fullness of who he is... God... Savior... Lord...

Lent is a season and time to look toward Jesus as he truly is. Jesus gave this glimpse of himself to Peter, James, and John in order to help them be prepared and not despair in the difficult trials ahead of Jesus' suffering and death. Seeing our God... Seeing Jesus transformed before us, allows us to experience ourselves enwrapped in God's love.

'Seeing Jesus as he is' means that I also see myself. Sometimes I don't particularly like what I see when I look at myself... I can find myself seeing my shortcomings and pitfalls. Sometimes, it even feels

like I want to give God reasons why he should consider me unlovable. The transfiguration is an announcement of God's love and glory. God loves us in an unconditional way. This means two things: we cannot earn God's love for us and we cannot do something that causes us to lose God's love for us.

THE TRANSFIGURATION AND BEING SEEN BY JESUS Sometimes we can feel unworthy of God's love. We can struggle to 'feel forgiven' and can struggle with the forgiveness of ourselves. God's love for us is what defines us. The Lord will call our name, even when we seem distant or lost. The Lord's love is something that renews and transforms us. While not by our own power, the Lord is at work transfiguring our own heart. The presence of God that dwells within us is given the freedom to shine through us.

The second reading (2 Tim 1:8b – 10) speaks about bearing 'our share of hardship for the Gospel'. We can make this into a weight that we carry or a cross that we bear. But that is only half of the phrase... "Bear your share of hardship for the Gospel with the strength that comes from God." This is not about white-knuckling our way to the finish line under our own power and steam. It is about letting the Lord into the challenges, burdens, and difficulties that we have.

Lent is not about walking through this time alone. Lent is about intentionally walking with the Lord in all things. Our own transfiguration... our own walk of glory is with Jesus. It's not about avoiding suffering or building impossible burdens for ourselves. It's about walking with our lives into the redemptive mystery to Calvary, to the tomb, and to the glory of Easter.

I pray that this Lenten experience is a blessing for you.

You will need your policy number and a valid email address. (Note email address can only be used once.) You will also be asked to make up a user name and password, which you and the policyholder will make up. Owners of the policies over 18 are allowed to log in.

SO, WHAT STARTED THE FISH FRY?

While the fish fry is primarily an American tradition, its roots can be found in the Germanic culture of the Midwest. The tradition is strongest in Wisconsin, where there are many German Catholics who enjoy fishing. The fish fry mostly took off in the 1920s and 1930s, when pubs were unable to sell beer during Prohibition. Fried fish dinners were seen as a very profitable source of new income, as fish was both plentiful from the many lakes in the state, as well as relatively low cost to make a dinner out of fish.

The fish fry has since expanded across the nation and is most prominent in areas where Catholicism, and to some extent, people of German descent, still reside. The fish fry does vary by region, whether by the main course (catfish in the South vs. walleye and cod in the Midwest vs. crab and lobster in the Northeast), the side dishes (hush puppies and vs. German potato salad/corn), or the places that offer fish fries, as even Baptists and Lutherans enjoy a good fish fry or two!
