

HOLY WEEK... IT'S HERE... LET US WALK WITH CHRIST!
This Sunday begins Holy Week. This is by far the most i

This Sunday begins Holy Week. This is by far the most important week of the year. We are invited in our liturgies to walk through this week with Jesus.

On Monday, the Chrism Mass at the Cathedral in Omaha is where we receive the oils that we will use in our parishes for different Sacraments this next year. There are 3 different oils:

- OI is the notation for the Oil of the Sick. We use this oil for the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick. OI abbreviates the Latin name Oleum Infirmorum.
- **OS** is the notation for the *Oil of Catechumens*. We use this oil in the Rite of Baptism. OS abbreviates the Latin name *Oleum Sanctum*.
- SC is the notation for the Sacred Chrism. We use this oil in Baptism, Confirmation, and the Ordination of priests and bishops. SC abbreviates the Latin name Sanctum Chrisma.

At the Chrism Mass, the priests of the diocese also gather to renew their priestly promises in front of the bishop.

On Thursday evening, the three-day Church season of Triduum begins with the Mass of the Lord's Supper. On this night, we experience the washing of feet that shows the servant leadership of Christ, the gift of the Eucharist, and the gift of the priesthood. At the end of the liturgy, we process through the Church to the altar of repose, where we enter into the garden of Gethsemane.

On Good Friday, the tabernacle is empty... we do not genuflect when we enter the Church. We hear the story of the death and crucifixion of Jesus. We pray for the Church, and then the Cross is revealed to us. Then every person is invited to come forward and venerate the cross... to kiss the cross, to touch the cross... we touch and unify ourselves, our difficulties, our hurts, our sufferings, and our crosses with Jesus' cross.

On Holy Saturday, we wait. The Easter Vigil begins at sundown. There is a new light and fire. We bless and light the Easter candle that symbolizes Jesus as light to us. We hear the story of salvation. We celebrate the Sacraments of Initiation for those who are joining the Church and maturing in their faith. Because of Jesus, there is new life... there is Easter.

RENEWING PRIESTLY PROMISES

The commitments to faithful priestly service that we make and renew each year are here below. It's a point of meditation for me as I consider my own vocation and call to love as a shepherd and minister.

My brothers and sisters in Christ, tonight we celebrate the memorial of the first Eucharist, on the anniversary of that day when Christ our Lord conferred his priesthood on his Apostles and on our priests.

Are you ready to renew your own dedication to Christ as priests of the new covenant? Priests: I am.

Are you resolved to be more united with the Lord Jesus and more closely conformed to him, denying yourselves and confirming those promises about sacred duties towards Christ's Church which, prompted by love of him, you willingly and joyfully pledged on the day of your priestly ordination? Priests: I am.

Are you resolved to be faithful stewards of the mysteries of God in the Holy Eucharist and the other liturgical rites and to discharge faithfully the sacred office of teaching, following Christ the Head and Shepherd, not seeking any gain, but moved only by zeal for souls? Priests: I am.

And the corresponding responsibility for parish:

I now address you, my brothers and sisters in the congregation. We are charged to pray for our priests and for our archbishop, that the Lord may pour out his gifts abundantly upon them, and keep them faithful as ministers of Christ the High Priest, so that they may lead us to Jesus Christ, who is the source of salvation.

Take time this week to enter into our holy celebrations!
