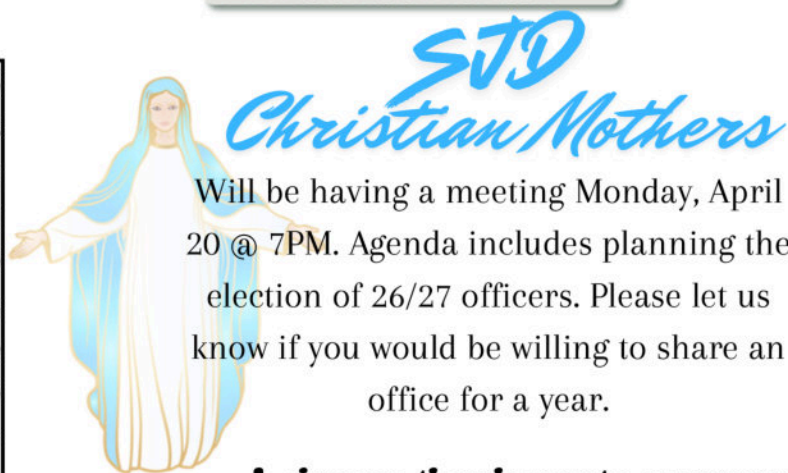

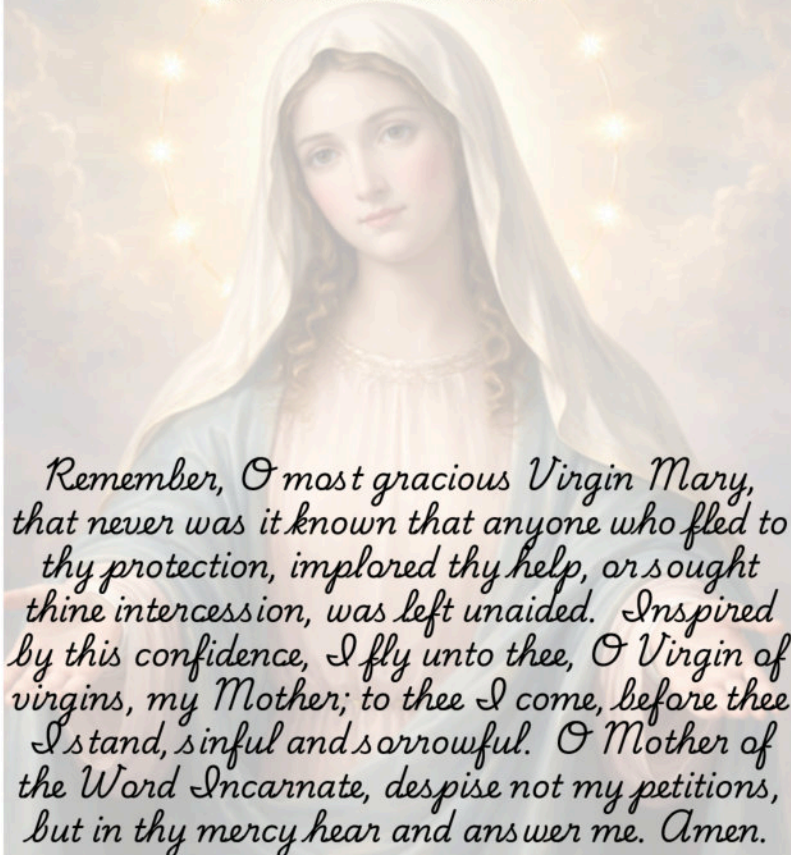

Dear parishioners,

I pray that you have had a holy Easter Week so far, but now we continue with the Easter season, which goes to Pentecost. What I thought might be helpful this week was to do a recap of what we have just been through to prepare for this season next year. It will be starting a week early, so I thought I would get ahead of the game.

Palm Sunday starts Holy Week. Most people know what happens, so I won't spend much time with it. Monday of Holy Week in many dioceses has the Chrism Mass. We have a big Mass at the Cathedral where many people witness the blessing of the three oils, Oil of Salvation, Oil of the Sick, and Sacred Chrism. As a priest I use the Oil of the Sick the most. That oil is to be a sign that everyone who is anointed with it has the whole church praying for them. We don't notify everyone when someone is anointed. It is just that God channels the grace of our general prayers for the sick, but also the prayer of all the priests and bishops around the world who pray at that Chrism Mass.

Tuesday of Holy Week is called Fig Tuesday. This reminds us of the day that the apostles see the fig tree that Jesus had cursed, dead. It died because it did not bear fruit. Jesus had been hungry and went to the tree for food, and found none, so he cursed it. Then he went into Jerusalem and overturned the tables of the money changers in the temple area. When he left Jerusalem to go back to Bethany, the apostles saw that the tree was dead. The next thing in Luke 11 was Jesus being questioned about his behavior in the temple. By what authority was he doing these things. He did not answer directly, but the apostles should have figured it out from the fig tree. It was the authority of God, who is the only one who can tell nature what to do. It is a great story that is worth looking at by reading the whole chapter of Luke 11.

Then comes Spy Wednesday. That is when Judas makes the deal with the priests of the temple. He became their informer, which he completed on Holy Thursday with a kiss. But there is a lot more to Holy Thursday. Jesus has the Last Supper, which is the first Mass. He ordains the apostles to be the priests of the new covenant. By definition, priests are to offer sacrifice. We are to offer Him as the one-time sacrifice until the end of the world, while it goes on in heaven, as the Book of Revelation describes.

After this first Mass, Jesus goes out to the Garden of Gethsemane to pray and asks the apostles to pray with him, and he is upset that they can't stay awake for an hour of prayer with Him. All around the world, people spent an extra hour of prayer in the Catholic churches after the last supper Mass and before midnight. In Omaha there were always groups of young people who went from church to church praying for about twenty minutes or more for about four hours. It was wonderful to witness. Some of us have lost this custom, others never knew it existed, and others ignore it. This is one of the reasons I am mentioning this now, so you can be better prepared for next year. Good Friday is always somber. This year God made it overcast, which, along with our fast and abstinence, really made for a great day of reflective prayer. We do a strange thing on this day. We kiss or venerate in another way an instrument of torture because it had been made with a dead tree that replaced the tree of life in the Garden of Eden. On that day the churches are bare, with no candles or flowers.

Then on Holy Saturday night we celebrate with lots of candles and flowers. As I mentioned, we have four people joining the church this year, just not on Holy Saturday night. I estimate that we had almost five hundred people join the church around the archdiocese on that night. And thousands across the country. I personally know of several churches that had between 50 and 80 people joining. So rejoice and be glad but make sure you are ready to get the most out of next year's Holy Week.

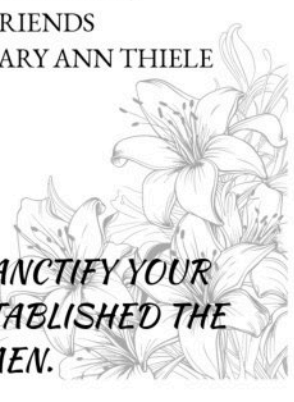
