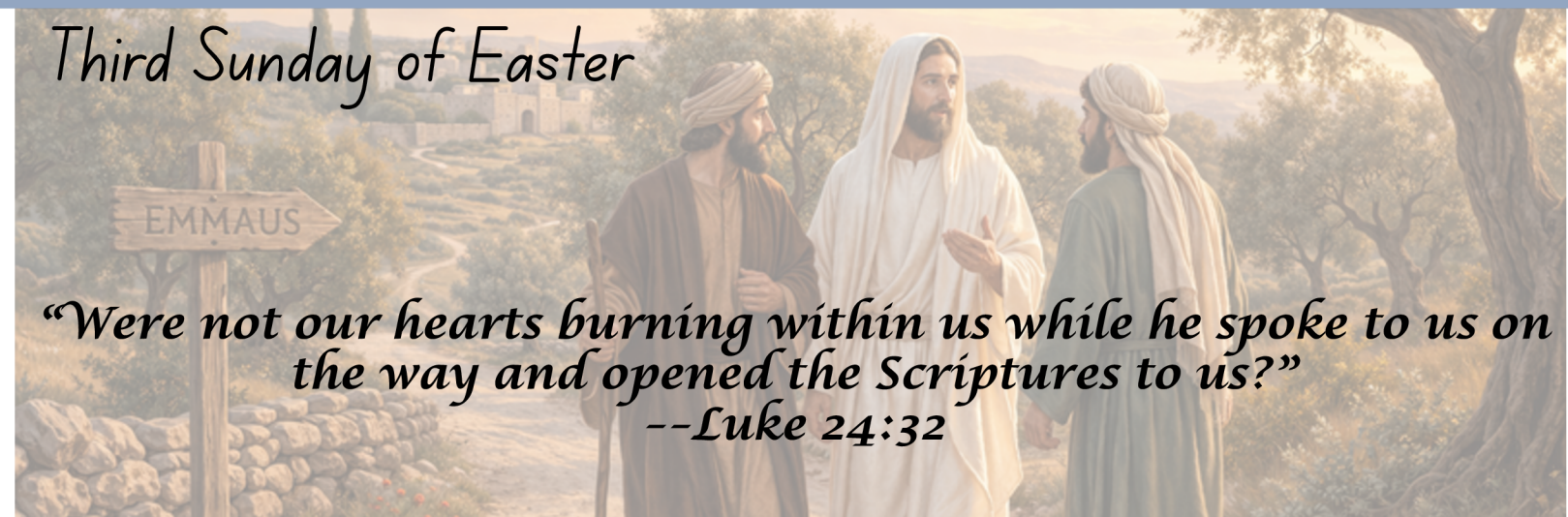

Perhaps you might find it helpful to hear your pastor's perspective on recent remarks traded back and forth in the media between Pope Leo XIV and President Trump. Our media loves a fight and has staged a conflict where the reality is less dramatic than the headlines suggest. Do they see the conflict in Iran the same way? Definitely not! However, each has an office with both authority and responsibility.

We find ourselves in the middle of two authority figures in our lives speaking differently to us and to the world. It is not a political standoff, even though the words said appear in the context of political turmoil.

The Pope has a Prophetic Role

The pope as spiritual leader has a prophetic role to speak truth rooted and grounded in the Gospel of Jesus Christ. The truths of the Gospel do sometimes challenge and convict us for the purpose of the conversion of our hearts and toward doing what is right. Proclaiming truth carries a seriousness — truth itself has lasting weight, like human dignity, justice, and concern for one's neighbor. That seriousness deepens when the one proclaiming it shows his conviction by the life he lives. It is both the testimony and the witness. In addition to proclaiming the truth, the pope offers his pastoral perspective and advice about what the prophetic words mean for us today.

The President is a Leader

The president serves as the top political leader in our country. His responsibilities are real and complex — national security, economic stability, infrastructure, and the rest of the needs of the American people. These are weighty obligations, and no one should dismiss them. He chose military action in Iran for reasons that haven't been completely explained to me. That doesn't mean the action isn't justified. What is clear to me is that both the prophetic words of Pope Leo and the pastoral perspectives offered have angered the president. When what is prophetic incites conviction and anger, sometimes that's an indicator that what was spoken brings additional deliberation and consideration to one's decision making.

The Outcome of a Better World

If our hope is for the outcome of a better world, then we should consider what that will look like. Our trust in our authority figures presumes that they want this outcome too. The prophetic voice asks a leader to pause, to examine whether his decisions and actions serve not only national interest but also the common good of the human family. The pope, though American, has a role to shepherd the Church throughout the world, and it seems that he wants to do it with an understanding heart. At the end of the day, Pope Leo is asking us to pray for peace and an end to this conflict and all the conflicts around the world. He is asking that families in conflict-ravaged areas can return to living their lives. He is asking that the families of military personnel can welcome those deployed home. We have two authority figures in our lives doing what they believe is right. Sometimes our contribution to the outcome of a better world might seem out of reach, but because prayer truly changes things, I'm going to do my part and pray for peace.
