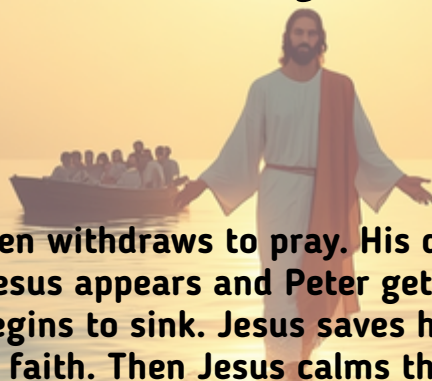

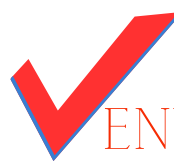

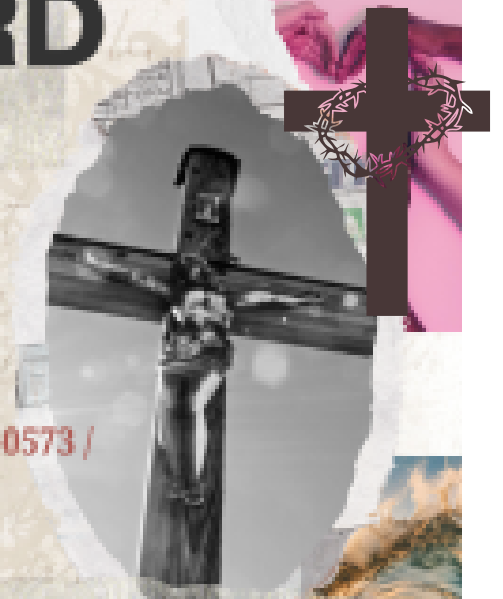

## **From the Desk of Father Frank**



Dear parishioners,

This is the first in a series of letters about how the Church views finances and how they affect our parish budgets. Since school is starting so soon, I will be looking at Catholic Education. As we have been celebrating the 250th anniversary of the founding of our nation, I have only noticed a few reports on the impact of the Catholic Church on the USA. I mentioned a few in my last letter, but another one is our Catholic school system.

In a nation that was built on creative thinking and ingenuity, it has been competition that has driven us to constant improvement. That is not the case in many other countries. Competition between public and Catholic schools has helped both be better. Saints like John Newman and Elizabeth Ann Seton pushed for these Catholic schools. As a result, many bishops ensured every new parish included a school. The bishops of the Archdiocese of Omaha took that very seriously. For a long time, we had the third largest Catholic school system in the USA. I don't know where that stands now, but the number of Catholic schools is diminishing. About twenty-five years ago we had 66 elementary schools, 19 high schools and 2 colleges. Now we have 47 elementary schools, 16 high schools, and two colleges. Demographics are a huge part. We have far less children. Our public schools are also feeling that crunch. Colleges and universities around the nation are competing to get students enrolled so they can survive.

One of the responsibilities that we have as Catholics is to pass our faith on to the next generation. In our family of parishes, we are doing this with Pope John XXIII Catholic school, our religious education programs in parishes, and our mini retreats like Legion of Joseph, TEC, JC Camp, etc. We are blessed in ways most of the country isn't because of what was handed on to us by previous generations. Dioceses all around us are trying to build their school systems because they realize what the early Catholics experienced, there is a lot of prejudices against Catholics. A bazaar example of this was when the previous administration had the FBI target people who went to Mass in Latin as terrorists. I grew up in a Catholic friendly atmosphere. My hometown had two Catholic churches and two full elementary schools. Few of us grew up with the kinds of attacks on our faith that our children are facing.

What does this mean for our parishes and our budgets? We cannot afford to slack off in our support of Catholic education. No system is perfect in a way that turns out 100% faithful Catholics. Even Jesus lost one out of twelve. Neighboring dioceses are trying to build Catholic schools because they know those schools have the best chance of succeeding. Our retreats have a powerful emotional impact on our young people, but they still need a lot more information. Our Wednesday religious education programs are trying their best, but some of the teachers feel like they are the blind leading the blind. That is what happens when you have generation after generation learning their faith in a one-hour session for maybe 40 weeks per year. It is always difficult to find people who are willing to teach these classes or help at retreats. Few people feel comfortable enough in their faith to try teaching. This is a shame because adults often learn their faith best by teaching it. To help with this, we are blessed with an abundance of teaching resources.

I see our Catholic schools as the foundation of our efforts to teach the next generations. Parents who learned their faith in those schools, even if they struggle with their relationship with God, are still needed to teach and help other parents who lack that background. Parents need support. The Church teaches they are the primary educators of their children's faith, but they need spiritual, emotional, and financial support. Spiritual support comes through these programs. Emotional comes from gathering each week for Mass, so we remember we are not alone in this process. Financial support comes through our Sunday offerings and special fundraisers. It takes a lot to run a Catholic school. We need everyone to help, not to just keep the school open now, but for the generations to come, so we aren't always faced with the blind leading the blind, which is happening in many areas around the world.

For this reason, the parishes in our family pay a subsidy to support this pillar of evangelization. Some wonder why their parish should help support the school if they have no students enrolled. The better question is why don't they have more children in that school? For the long term spiritual benefit of their children and their parish. We should encourage families to provide their children with this opportunity. I've been in areas in which parishes subsidy was based on how many students attended the Catholic school. Within a generation there were people in those parishes trying to convince families not to send their children so there wouldn't be a subsidy. To me, that would be like buying less seed corn to plant to lessen the expenses. In our family of eight parishes, every parish contributes so tuition remains affordable.

Our current process for figuring out each parish's subsidy is as follows. Currently, the total amount needed is \$600,000. St. Boniface in Elgin (SBE) pays 62.67% or \$370,000. St. Bonaventure in Raeville (SBR) pays 6.66% or \$40,000. St. John the Baptist in Petersburg (SJP) pays 6.67% or \$40,000. Annunciation parish which includes Tilden, Neligh, Clearwater, Ewing, and Deloit pay 25% or \$150,000. The percentages stay the same each year. The costs tend to rise so the amounts change.

Our other religious education costs are minimum compared to that. But having worked all over the archdiocese, I see this as a good system. Having traveled all over the world, I see the downside of losing this system. As I mentioned in my last letter, Pope St. John Paul II saw the USA as the best model to show how evangelization can work.

My next letter will be looking at how finances of each of our parish sites are looking. Even though five sites are now called Annunciation Parish, it is still good to know how they stand.
