



DATAPOINTS THAT GIVE US INFORMATION

A July 28 news analysis piece on The Pillar (pillarcatholic.com) by Brendan Hodge looked at the General Social Survey (GSS) of adults taken up in the United States since 1988. It helps us see cultural trends in 'religiosity' and belief in God. The analysis questions applied the research data was "How successful are we at passing on the faith to the next generation?" and "How does religious practice now impact what we would expect religious belief to look like in the future?"



In the 2018 GSS, of those adults who identified as having a Catholic upbringing, 58% said today they "Know God exists", 26% said today they had "Some belief in God", 12% said today they believed in "Some higher power", and 12% said today they have "No belief in God".

You might be wondering why I'm pulling up this data... When data is used in decision making, it is impersonal, measured, and objective. That really doesn't sound like faith. Faith is the belief and trust in a personal relationship between God and myself. Using external indicators is not going to identify the fullness of the internal reality in my heart called faith. Using external indicators is a way of speaking about more general trends. If we

take readings as an analogy, data asks if you can read a message in a (yes/no) way while the internal reality might be that reading may be enjoyable or difficult or challenging depending on one's internal reality. Sherry Weddell, author of Forming Intentional Disciples, says "Never accept a label in place of a story." This means that the data trends (or labels) we see are intended to be descriptive of our reality and context... but each data point collected has a corresponding story that defines/explains why a person is where they are at today.

This same 2018 survey shows for adult Americans born since 1980 that only 57% of those who identified a "Catholic upbringing" still identify themselves as "Catholics" and 30% identify themselves as "Nothing" today. We probably can think of family members and friends who have left the Catholic faith or have simply stopped coming. Because faith, faith practice, and free will are involved, there is no causal relationship. Faith outcomes are not guaranteed with the certainty that the laws of physics have. If I jump, gravity will make sure I stay grounded.

SUPPORTING PARENTS AND HOUSEHOLDS OF FAITH

A strong principle of Catholic theology and life is the primary role of parents as educators of the faith. The faith community has a role in supporting parents in their vocation.

Despite the fact that there is no causal guarantee on the faith outcomes of the next generation, there are many intentional choices we can make for our families as households of faith. What we do and how we choose to live leaves a strong impression on the hearts of our kids. Our actions, our behaviors, our priorities, and our words form our families and our kids... This can sound impossible or scary. Remember, though, that God calls us to faithfulness and not to perfect execution.

This year, we want to live our faithfulness with intentionality.
