GROWTH AND PROGRESS MEANS THAT THINGS SHOULDN'T STAY THE SAME

Perhaps it's because an 8-bit Nintendo was part of my upbringing, but the Super Mario Brothers comes to mind when I think about growth and change. Starting as a little Mario, I'd search after a Mushroom to become a big Mario, or a fiery plant to throw fireballs, or a leaf to fly in a racoon suit. Different levels were best played with different skills. Each challenge could be met and overcome.

Several years ago, I went to a reunion of my classmates from St. Columbkille Grade School in Papillion. I graduated in 2001 from 8th grade. We got together in 2009, just after I had finished four years of college seminary and earned my bachelor's degree in Philosophy and Catholic Studies. We wanted to know where everybody was in life.

Conversing, it was really easy to share some memories and stories from our experiences. Everyone and everything seemed so familiar, normal, and comfortable. I made a comment about this to one of my classmates, and she said, "I'm not the same person that you knew. My life has made me different than you remember me."

I guess that, in some ways, when we had parted ways, my brain hit 'pause' on my mental VCR. For those that may not know, a VCR would record shows off the TV onto a tape cassette for us to watch later. When I stopped encountering the person on a regular basis, I subconsciously assumed that they would be exactly the same as when I left them, except look older.

I'm a different person at 32 than I was at 14, 18, 22, or 26. Why shouldn't they be different as well?

WHAT WE REMEMBER THINGS TO BE LIKE

I enjoy learning local history and family stories. The best gifts that Fr. Kramper gave me when I moved into Ewing were the centennial books for St. Peter's (1985), St. Theresa's (1986), and Rural St. John's (2010). There were many details and stories about what brought people to our communities and what their faith and parish leadership led them to build (and in some cases, rebuild and rebuild again). The world that formed and shaped us is not the exactly same world that we live in today.

One of the things that greets me on my way into every community is the road sign with the local population on it. I like looking at numbers and trends, and so I pulled the US Census Bureau data for the last four official censuses. I'm curious to see what 2020 data will show. I've put our various neighboring communities next to each other, including also numbers for Neligh and Tilden.

As the pastoral plan calls for us to become eight churches for two priests within the next five years, I believe that the numbers show that our communities and our communities of faith need each other. The Archdiocese Planning Office sees the grouping formed from the eight churches in the area as a community of communities of faith numbering 1200 families.

This is why I emphasize the mission and purpose for why we exist as *Together*, *We Make Disciples*.

Dear Fr. Kevin Vogel,

It was very good talking to you arranging my coming for Mission Cooperation on the next month. Thank you very much for making this possible.

I will come on Saturday and leave after the last Mass on Sunday.

And here is some information about Songea Archdiocese:

Archdiocese of Songea is found in the Southern part of Tanzania, East Africa. It serves about 350,000 Catholics. The diocese also serves non-Catholics by providing social services such as education, water, medical care and housing for some orphans.

We are facing various financial challenges as we continue our ministry in this local Church. Some of the services that we need help in order to fulfill our ministry are:

- Formation for future priests. At the moment we have 19 Major Seminarians in our Major Seminaries in Tanzania. We support these Seminarians for tuition, health insurance and other needs.
- On-going formation for priests. We try to give our priests the capacity for more effective evangelization.
- Taking care of old and sick priests. We have some old priests who need to be financially helped to cover the expenses of health requirements.
- Catechesis. We have a number of Catechists who are working and fulfilling different roles in the evangelization; one of them being to impact religious and Christian education to the Catechumens, and other candidates of the Sacraments. They also supervise small Christian communities. Some of these Catechists would need means of transport like bicycles or motor cycles.
- Children and Youth: animation for children and youth in the diocese. We have vocational school where the unfortunate students who miss the opportunities to go for further studies after primary school can acquire knowledge according to their vocation.

These are some of the challenges we have. Unfortunately the diocese has no major source of income, and most of the Christians especially in the ruler areas have no power to support the Church economically, for they themselves come to the Church asking for support.


