HE AIN'T HEAVY ... HE'S MY BROTHER

In what is now the West Omaha area, the Boys Town organization that was founded by Fr. Edward Flanagan continues to serve families and children today. One story from their history involves a child with polio who was helped by being carried up and down the stairs. When asked by Fr. Flanagan whether this was a burden, one of the boys helping responded, "He ain't heavy, Father... He's m' brother."

BEING BROTHERS IS SOLIDARITY

The Catholic Social Teaching principle of solidarity recognizes that 'we are all in this together.' We are one human family, and we seek to support those treated unfairly, the forgotten, and those in need. In fact, solidarity has been in the mind and on the heart of Pope Francis. He just released an encyclical titled "Brothers All" or "Fratelli Tutti" that goes in depth on many issues surrounding the brotherhood of the human family.

POPE FRANCIS IN HIS OWN WORDS (FRATELLI TUTTI #8)

It is my desire that, in this our time, by acknowledging the dignity of each human person, we can contribute to the rebirth of a universal aspiration to fraternity. Fraternity between all men and women. "Here we have a splendid secret that shows us how to dream and to turn our life into a wonderful adventure. No one can face life in isolation... We need a community that supports and helps us, in which we can help one another to keep looking ahead. How important it is to dream together... By ourselves, we risk seeing mirages, things that are not there. Dreams, on the other hand, are built together". Let us dream, then, as a single human family, as fellow travelers sharing the same flesh, as children of the same earth which is our common home, each of us bringing the richness of his or her beliefs and convictions, each of us with his or her own voice, brothers and sisters all.

SOLIDARITY AS A TYPE OF COMMUNION ... A 'BEING WITH' ...

Solidarity asks me to consider what happens to my neighbor. It is not about trying to control another person or their actions. Instead, we recognize our community's strengths and virtues to

October 18, 2020 make them stronger... and we have to recognize honestly our community's weaknesses, shortcomings, and wrongs so that they can be righted. These simple approaches take us into our complex world with complex problems.

The pressures present in the world almost always take us in a dehumanizing direction. We've already spoken about the dignity of the human person and the concept of the common good. When someone is looking to maximize their profitability and position in the world, it can be easy to see a person or group of people as numbers on a balance sheet or as less lucky than me or as less important than me. If the human person is lessened to their human labor or production, then I have objectified a person and I rob them of the dignity and value that belongs to them as a child of God.

Solidarity is the conviction that I have a part to play in the solution. When someone is wronged or mistreated, solidarity is about joining their side. Jesus tells us the parable of the Good Samaritan in answer to the question, "And who is my neighbor?"

COMPLEX ISSUES WHERE WE SHOULD HAVE CONVERSATIONS Access to Health Care: Everyone should have access to quality health care. Our country has chosen an insurance based model to provide health care. It is an imperfect model. We are also finding the expenses of this system increasing exponentially in a way that could be unsustainable. Are there changes we can make to the system to better access, affordability or quality of care.

Immigration: Our country is made up of many immigrants from many countries. How have we welcomed immigrants? How do we welcome immigrants today? How do we help immigrants become American? For many of us, our families immigrated and moved here with the hope of making a better life. A country has the right to protect its borders, make laws, and limit immigration. There is also a limit to how many a local culture can amalgamate into a community at a time. Yet our current immigration system has become broken in its bureaucratic process.

Unjust Discrimination and Racism: When someone experiences discrimination against them for something like ethnicity, the color of one's skin, gender, age, or religion, this demeaning action fosters anger, distrust, stereotypes, prejudices, and the like. Our country's history of racism has not been completely healed. This conversation is not finished. Each person has a right to be known, honored, cherished, and respected.

Environment: We live on the earth that God has created. It is our common home. We are called to a stewardship of the world, and sometimes our world is exploited instead. Pollution, waste, and consumption happen. This is our world. We have to consider both how we live here now and how the next generations will live here as well. The whole world must work together on this.

Selling Grain to Benefit Your Church:



Producers are reminded that the following needs to take place in order for you to legally remove the grain sale or livestock from your taxable income:

1) The commodity is delivered to facility.

2) The donor signs a form (at the facility or from the parish office) that states the commodity now belongs to the charity. 3) The facility mails the check/scale ticket to the charity. **NOTE:** Donations of grain in the charity's name cannot be claimed as an itemized charitable contribution so therefore will be posted as such on your end of the year contribution statement from the parish.
