NAH DAWG MATIBED

Sometimes prayer is difficult. Sometimes continuing to pray for something is even more difficult. And sometimes we stop praying because *we get tired*. I think that the panda meme shows how we can feel at times about praying to God.

TOO TIRED TO PRAY?

I have heard people tell me that they are too busy to pray more. When I feel that I am too busy to pray more than I am, it is usually my way of saying that I am too tired to pray more... that I am too tired to concentrate, that I am too tired to keep my eyes open, that I am too tired to listen to Him above the regular noise of my day... that I am too tired to construct a coherent sentence... that I am too tired to care what God might want to say to me.

In the first reading (Ex 17: 8-13), Moses goes up a mountain to pray while the Israelites are in battle. When Moses raises his hands in prayer, Israel does well. However, when Moses rests his hands, their enemies prevail in the fight. He gets tired... he's trying to pray all day long, and he cannot hold his hands up. Moses' companions end up holding up his hands. By the end of that day, prayer was physically painful for Moses. He could not have held his arms in prayer by himself. Israel would not have won the battle if Moses had not been praying. Prayer was at the heart of the victory won that day. Prayer invited God to make His power and might known in their midst.

WHAT DOES PRAYING WITHOUT CEASING MEAN?

St. Paul uses a challenging phrase in 1 Thessalonians 5:17. He challenges and exhorts us to *pray without ceasing*. It's hard to know how we are meant to accomplish this. Sometimes it

is rendered as *pray at all times*. This also doesn't seem

possible to accomplish. When I was between my sophomore and junior years of college seminary, I was living at home and I was working the summer... about 60 hours a week between two jobs. Through a temporary employment agency, I ended up cleaning used truck brakes to be refitted with new brake pads during the day. At night, I went back to my high school employer at Runza. By the end of both shifts, I was

completely wiped. I'd stop by the church on the way home to pray, and I didn't seem to have any energy left for an intensive exercise. I would pray "God, take everything that I am and that I have. I don't have the energy to hold anything back from You."

It was also a summer of grace for me too. God gave me a strong sense of His presence. The image in my mind is that of being held in my Grampa's arms as a kid when I was little. He held me with love as he leaned back in his recliner, and we didn't need words to talk.

It wouldn't have occurred to me at the time, if a friend hadn't suggested it. It can be possible to pray while we are working. Sometimes the jobs that we do take all of our attention and focus; sometimes our tasks are very routine and do not always tax our attention and focus. The prayer doesn't have to be something as formal or structured or counted like the rosary or a Divine Mercy chaplet. Instead, we can use our own breathing as a keeping of pace. We can pray a phrase as we inhale, and pray the response as we exhale.

In Eastern Christianity, a popular devotion is the Jesus prayer of breathing four phrases...

- 1. Lord Jesus Christ (Breathe In)
- 2. Son of the Living God (Breathe Out)
- 3. Have Mercy on Me (Breathe In)
- 4. A Sinner (Breathe Out) And Repeat

Sometimes my prayer is even simpler:

- 1. Lord Jesus Be with Me (Breathe In)
- 2. Always at work in Me (Breathe Out) And Repeat

Praying without ceasing isn't about us always talking. It's about learning to always be with Him.
