

PARISH MINISTRY IN THE 21ST CENTURY

One of the big changes that happened in July was that Fr. Vogel and I went from being two pastors of two different clusters to being a pastor and an associate pastor of a larger parish grouping. I'm starting to realize that this change may be felt more dramatically with you, our parishioners, than I first thought.

I grew up in St. Columbkille Parish in Papillion, NE. For as long as I can remember, we always had two priests in the parish... one pastor and one associate pastor. In most of our faith communities, we've only had one priest assigned at a time... one pastor, one priest at a time. Something that I thought was normal (having two priests at a church) is different than what our faith communities have come to expect as normal (having one priest at a time).

Our previous model of priest placements was to embed a priest in a single community or in a small number of communities. This is similar to how the US Army embeds chaplains with their troops. You get to know the priest, you are more likely to see him on the street or in the grocery store or in the post office. If you like him... or can at least tolerate him... then this can work, but this model requires more priest personnel than we have or will have in the near future. If you don't like the priest, there's usually another priest a few miles down the road. This model sees the priest primarily as a support resource for the community. As we have had reduced numbers of priest personnel, the cluster assignments started to cover more area. The priest is told 'to do more with less' and is stretched over another community.

Our new model is team based and mission driven. In our clergy team, we have 2 priests and 2 deacons. As pastor, that makes me the team leader. At the same time, it doesn't mean that I personally have to be present at every event, gathering, or meeting. Our new model defines the ministry area of our six parishes and then asks 'how can we best serve'. Sometimes you may see me, sometimes Fr. Vogel, sometimes Deacon Dennis, sometimes Deacon John... sometimes together, sometimes not. We have the role to preach the Gospel here, but how we accomplish this can be felt very differently. Even on the weekend, we may not see the priest or deacon that we are used to seeing. I think that it is an opportunity to start a relationship with another priest... learning how to hear him, learning how he speaks, learning if he tells funny jokes, learning why he so passionately loves God and wants to serve you in ministry. Maybe it might feel a little more like a business than a neighbor, but I assure you that we love and pray for each of you in our communities of faith. Getting to know each other in this new reality just continues to take both time and effort.
