



If you will 'indulge' me...

In the Catholic Church, the month of November emphasizes a remembrance of the deceased...those who have gone before us in faith. It is a common practice in many of our churches to have a "Book of the Dead" for special remembrance during the month's liturgies. We pray for the dead on November 1st with the celebration of All Saints' Day, and we pray for the dead on November 2nd with the commemoration of All Souls' Day.

All Saints' Day celebrates those who are experiencing deep communion with God in the joys of Heaven. It is a day of celebration, encouragement, and hope for us. All Souls' Day remembers those who have died, who may be encountering God's love as a purifying preparation for Heaven through the experience of Purgatory. For us, this day of remembering loved ones reminds us of the gift of faith in Jesus as Savior, the gift of mercy that Jesus bestows from the cross, and the well-founded hope that God's love prepares us to see him face to face... even when it requires a purifying of our souls. Our Church teaches that through our prayers, we can aid these souls on their journey to eternal rest with God. The mercy of reaching Purgatory means that our divided hearts will be healed, and we will not experience the eternal separation from God that is Hell.

In this month of November, we have special graces (called indulgences) for pious devotional practices of remembering the dead. The word 'indulgence' has some historical baggage from the time of Martin Luther and the Protestant Reformation. However, an indulgence is not a 'buying of grace' but rather it is a devotional practice that opens our hearts to receive a special grace that the Church freely gives.

From The Handbook for Indulgences n.1, "An indulgence is a remission before God of the temporal punishment for sins, whose guilt is forgiven, which a properly disposed member of the Christian faithful obtains under certain and clearly defined conditions through the intervention of the Church, which, as the minister of Redemption, dispenses and applies authoritatively the treasury of the expiatory works of Christ and the saints."

Temporal punishment due to sin refers not to the forgiveness of the sin itself but the spiritual residue remaining. As an analogy, if I burn myself while cooking, forgiveness treats the burn but temporal punishment would be the scar that shows up afterwards. Indulgences can be partial or plenary (full) remission of temporal punishment.

In seeking any plenary indulgence, there are three conditions: going to confession, receiving Communion, and prayers for the intention of the Holy Father. These conditions may be fulfilled several days before or after the performance of the prescribed work.

You can seek to receive an indulgence for yourself or for someone deceased. There is a limit of receiving one indulgence as plenary per day, and the others received would be partial.

Some of the regular devotional practices that can qualify for a plenary indulgence are adoration of the Blessed Sacrament for at least a half hour, doing the Stations of the Cross, recitation of the rosary in a church, in a family, or in a group, and the devout reading or listening to the Sacred Scriptures for at least a half hour. These are good practices to grow in our faith, and they open us to receive the additional grace of an indulgence.

During November, Catholics are encouraged to receive indulgences for the souls in purgatory. The Church offers these indulgences to encourage the faithful to pray for the dead and to reflect on the communion of saints.

## Special Opportunities Praying for the Faithful Departed

From November 1st to November 8th, the Church grants a plenary indulgence, applicable only to the souls in purgatory, each day to the faithful who devoutly visit a cemetery and pray, even if only mentally, for the departed.

On All Souls' Day, November 2nd, or the Sunday following, Catholics can gain a plenary indulgence, applicable only to the souls in purgatory, by devoutly visiting a church or oratory and reciting the Our Father and the Creed.

Additionally, a partial indulgence, applicable only to the souls in purgatory, can be obtained by those who recite the Eternal Rest prayer ("Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May they rest in peace. Amen.") and by visiting and praying at a cemetery any other day of the year.


