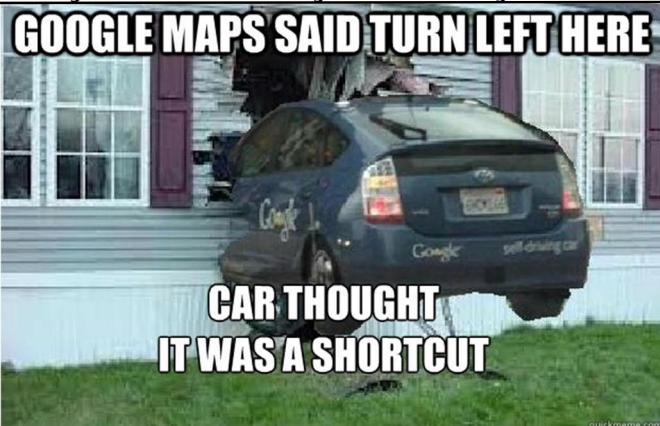

Sometimes it's good to ask where we're at and where we're going. As I spend some additional time on the roads between our communities, I'm finding that I can't overcome the laws of physics. Travel takes time... there's not really many shortcuts to get where we're going and the speedometer only makes so much difference. We learn the routes we prefer, and we plan around our travel.

I think that this is also a good way to think about this new parish configuration... our parish grouping that we're calling "Catholic Parishes in Partnership". Each of our parishes maintains its identity as a distinctive community of faith, yet we are moving administratively towards a more unified and shared structure.

DEFINING A PASTORAL AREA

The original meaning of the word 'catholic' is universal. It comes from the Greek word *katholikos*. If you've followed along in the book during the Nicene Creed, you may notice that we pray for "one, holy, catholic, and apostolic Church." It's not a misprint where they forgot to capitalize something; it's that the creed meant universal, rather than a specific institution.

Regardless of whether we have one, two, six, or sixty churches, the Archbishop assigns priests to serve and cover a geographic territory. The bishop did that during the time that our churches were founded and priests traveled by train or by horse. The archbishop still does this today. We call this our pastoral area or our parish grouping.

Priests are entrusted with the pastoral care of all people that live within a pastoral area. We sometimes can think that Catholics take care of Catholics, Lutherans take care of Lutherans, Methodists take care of Methodists, Presbyterians, Evangelicals, unaffiliated, etc. The truth is that we all have an obligation to be Catholic and Christian to everyone we meet. This means that we

have a mission to make Jesus known; that we do not discount the value and dignity of each person that we meet.

STEWARDSHIP OF HERITAGE AND RESOURCES

In the recent pastoral planning context of the Archdiocese, oftentimes we had fears about what was going to be lost, what was going to change, what was going to happen to our history and heritage. After several early attempts at planning by the Meitler Consultants that picked 'winners and losers' among our parishes with closings, consolidations, and mergers in the Rural Central Deanery, we were given this chance to build a future together in partnership with our neighbors. We're still figuring out everything that's involved in 'together' and 'partnership'. The archbishop was very encouraging to us in our discovery of this new model during his parish visit. We have preserved the heritage of our parish communities.

In July, we changed our Mass schedule. We defined 'fair' as "each church gets one weekend Mass, either on Saturday or on Sunday." In our study, there was no church that would be short of seating. This is still new and different for us. And this change is still hard and difficult for some of us. Change is hard. At the same time, our churches often feel fuller when we celebrate Mass as a community of faith. This enhances our experience of worship. We can also anticipate stability with this schedule.

It seems that people are able to find Mass with the new schedule. I strongly encourage you to find the time that works. We have many churches with many seats. And we have one for you and your family! We have the gift of community to help us grow.

We have the Mass times spread across our six churches. The long range plan is that we will eventually have eight churches. Our current challenge is to figure out how we can be present in each community and how we sustain and support each community.

Each parish has expenses to maintain physical structures, and each parish has obligations for shared expenses for the administrative and pastoral services that support us. Regardless of the Mass time or church that you attend, please support and give to your "home" church. Any envelope or check can make it back to your home church. 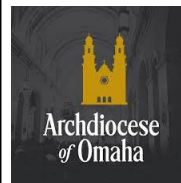
