

ADVENT... A SEASON OF PREPARATION... OF GETTING READY When a year ends and a new one begins, it's good to take a deep breath moment to reflect and see where we've been and where we are going. This season of Advent is a gift from the Church to help us do this. Especially when our world around us pressures us with extra frenetic activity, we are invited to prayer, planning, preparation, and peace.

SPIRITUAL CLEANING... PARISH PENANCE / RECONCILIATION This year we are looking to have parish penance services during our Advent season. Sin creates a spiritual weight that we carry, and forgiveness removes this weight and strengthens us with grace. We want people to have the opportunity to have these burdens lifted. In addition to our regular confession times:

 - o 4:30PM St. Boniface in Elgin
- On Sun Dec 18 (with the help of area priests):

 - 3:30PM St. Theresa's in Clearwater

PREPARING FOR TWO COMINGS OF CHRIST

I know that my miles of ministry often causes me to see a mechanic for a tune-up and an oil change. The first part of Advent asks us to consider how ready we are for the 2nd coming of Christ. What if Jesus comes back for the end of the world and the beginning of the new creation? Am I ready and prepared for his judgment? Am I ready and prepared to accept salvation on his terms, rather than dictating my own terms? The first part of Advent helps me to see where I struggle to let Jesus be my King, my Lord, my Savior.

The second part of Advent focuses on how Jesus came to us 2000 years ago and how he comes to me today. God does not demand that we climb some mountain to ascend to him. God descends to us. Jesus appears in all humility... because the all-powerful God becomes as vulnerable and needy as a baby. God will move heaven and earth to meet us, save us, and redeem us. He calls love out of us, and he makes us capable of so much more by his grace and love. The first part of Advent is about whether I am ready to go meet God. The second part of Advent is about whether I am ready to receive him as he comes.

WHAT DOES 'DOING ADVENT' LOOK LIKE?

We have these next four Sundays of Advent to reflect on the promise of God coming to us.

As we begin this season, you might have an Advent wreath on your table or in your home that helps us count down our way to Christmas. These themes are meant to accompany the weeks of our Advent season:

- The 1st Sunday of Advent symbolizes Hope with the "Prophet's Candle" reminding us that Jesus is coming.
- The 2nd Sunday of Advent symbolizes Faith with the "Bethlehem Candle" reminding us of Mary and Joseph's journey to Bethlehem.
- The 3rd Sunday of Advent symbolizes Joy with the "Shepherd's Candle" reminding us of the Joy the world experienced at the coming birth of Jesus.
- The 4th Sunday of Advent symbolizes Peace with the "Angel's Candle" reminding us of the message of the angels: "Peace on Earth, Good Will Toward Men."

The Seven Sisters Apostolate

The mission of the Seven Sisters Apostolate is "committed prayerful support toward a parish pastor through the assurance of the offering of at least one Holy Hour every day of any given week for that pastor alone." We are looking for seven women who would commit to one Holy Hour each week to pray specifically for our pastor, Fr. John. You would be assigned a particular day of the week, and your hour could be prayed at any time during that day. Your commitment is for one year at a time, from June to June, so this first year would not be a full year. What does it mean that God "speaks" to me?

Very few of the saints have ever had experiences in which God speaks to them in a loud booming voice or even in a whispering voice. Often, in the Christian life, the voice of God is something that must be discerned... something that we must give quiet time and reflection to.

To hear God's voice, we must give God time to speak to us... if we constantly are watching TV or running from this kid's sporting event to our other kid's band concert we rarely have time to stop. Yet, many times if we would just stop and give God the chance, he would give us peace and direction.

God speaks to us in many ways. He often speaks to us through his inspired word in Sacred Scripture. This is one reason it is so important to read the Bible. He also speaks to us in the movements of our hearts. When we hear something, read something or discern something and we feel peace and closer to God.... That is God's voice.

But how can I be certain the difference between God's thoughts and mine? First, God will never tell me anything contrary to what he has revealed through His Church. For example, God's voice can't tell me it's OK to take His name in vain. Secondly, God's voice comes with a sense of peace, even when God is asking something challenging and hard... we respond with peace in our heart. If we are in doubt, we should consult a wise spiritual director; such as a religious brother or sister or a priest.
