ADVENT... A SEASON TO PRACTICE THE PRESENCE OF GOD We celebrate being more than half done with Advent... so the Church says 'Gaudete', meaning 'Rejoice!' The Latin language is not making a suggestion here... it's an imperative! It's a command! We must 'rejoice'. God is here! Jesus is coming!

#### GAUDETE IS ABOUT SEARCHING AND DISCOVERY

Sometimes big changes happen in bits and pieces. Sometime big changes happen in steps. Each step forward has times to celebrate the 'win' accomplished. We want to celebrate what has happened. This week, we hear the questions asked to John the Baptist... Are you the one we've been looking for? Are you the one for whom we've been preparing the way? ...

John the Baptist points something out to us in his response. He doesn't pretend to be the answer to the longing of our hearts. He says that there is someone else we are searching for. Jesus invites those asking to discover the answer themselves. Jesus is not reducing himself to an academic answer to an intellectual question. Jesus doesn't put himself as an answer on a multiple choice test. It does not become enough for us to know the answer to the question. We have to own the answer in our hearts.

When Jesus is the source of our joy, we do rejoice! Faith becomes the most important gift that we can give and share. We can't force someone else to have faith, but we can lead and invite someone to share the experience of a faith-filled life. Our own faith is deepened and is strengthened when we seek to learn, to know, and to understand what we believe more clearly... but the learning, the knowledge, and the understanding cannot replace the need for the gift of faith.

#### THE DESTINATION OF ADVENT

We are in the middle of two different destinations. The first destination is about getting ready for the coming of Christ at Christmas. The second destination is about being ready for the second coming of Christ... the coming of Christ in glory. Christmas is about getting ready for Christ to come. The second coming is about us being ready to go to heaven. One of the traditional beliefs in the church was that the second coming of Christ would happen in the Advent season. We want to be ready for eternity... for forever... for going to meet our God. This is one of the reasons why we have a tradition and strongly encourage use of the Sacrament of Reconciliation in Adventtime. It is a gift for me as a priest to hear confessions... especially in this season. Oftentimes, in our stressful COVID-crazed lives, we have needed to adapt and accommodate and change so many things so quickly. For us, this often means that we are carrying so much weight on our shoulders, further burdened by sin, and we have the opportunity to bring these weights and burdens to Jesus's forgiveness. He takes them away. For me as a priest, the joy of celebrating the Sacrament of Reconciliation is about watching Jesus lift the burden of sin that we carry.

#### CHRISTMAS ACCOMMODATIONS FOR COVID

As we plan for Christmas in the midst of COVID-world, we are making some accommodations... for this year only. Since we don't know what to expect and may have many travelers from outside our communities coming, prudence requires us to be seated every other pew and we again strongly encourage with our local health departments the wearing of a face covering. While not ideal, we are expanding our ability to handle overflow in parish halls and such. We are also adding mass times, hoping that we can safely accommodate as many as possible inside our church buildings.

# **Charitable Contributions Deduction Modifications**

Taxpayers who do not otherwise elect to itemize deductions are allowed an above-the-line deduction in 2020 for up to \$300

for charitable contributions made in cash (not stock) to any qualifying Section 501(c)(3) public charity, excluding donor-advised funds. In addition, for individuals who itemize, the CARES Act temporarily increases limitations on deductions for charitable contributions made in 2020.

## Bethlehem Revisited...Coming To You!



I hope that 2020 can be remembered as the seventh and the last time that we did Bethlehem Revisited. The first time was at Tekamah in 2003. Then it went to the edge of Omaha, Lindsay, Schuyler, Ewing and Homer area in 2013. I thought we were done, but God has been nudging me to do it one more time.

"Bethlehem Revisited" is more than a living nativity; it is an interactive experience of what that first Christmas was like. It has all the animals, including three camels. People play the part of the Wise Men, Shepherds, Shopkeepers and the Holy Family. Dollars can be changed into Bethlehem coins, so you can buy things from the marketplace, to take home.

It will be open in Newcastle, NE, in a building one block south of Main St., from 1:00-7:00 pm, on the two Sundays after Christmas. In the Spirit of St. Francis, we invite you to experience the true meaning of Christmas. Blessing in 2020 and beyond,
