

#### **GAUDETE SUNDAY MEANS REJOICE!!**

The internet sensation 'grumpy cat' shown above clearly does not understand the meaning of Gaudete! Rejoice! This Sunday we celebrate being more than halfway through the Advent season of preparation. Advent is both about the journey and the destination.

#### **GAUDETE IS ABOUT THE JOURNEY**

Sometimes big changes happen in bits and pieces. Sometime big changes happen in steps. Each step forward has times to celebrate the 'win' accomplished. We want to celebrate what has happened. Last week, we heard the preaching of John the Baptist. This week, we hear the question asked to Jesus... Are you the one we've been looking for? Are you the one for whom we've been preparing the way? ...

Jesus points something out to us in his response. He doesn't just name himself as the answer, as the one being sought. Jesus invites those asking to bring the evidence and testimony to John the Baptist and let him discover the answer for himself. Jesus is not reducing himself to an academic answer to an intellectual question. Jesus doesn't put himself as an answer on a multiple choice test. It does not become enough for us to *know* the answer to the question. We have to *own* the answer in our hearts.

When Jesus is the source of our joy, we do rejoice! Faith becomes the most important gift that we can give and share. We can't force someone else to have faith, but we can lead and invite someone to share the experience of a faith-filled

life. Our own faith is deepened and is strengthened when we seek to learn, to know, and to understand what we believe more clearly... but the learning, the knowledge, and the understanding cannot replace the need for the gift of faith.

#### THE DESTINATION OF ADVENT

We are in the middle of two different destinations. The first destination is about getting ready for the coming of Christ at Christmas. The second destination is about being ready for the second coming of Christ... the coming of Christ in glory. Christmas is about getting ready for Christ to come. The second coming is about us being ready to go to heaven. One of the traditional beliefs in the church was that the second coming of Christ would happen in the Advent season. We want to be ready for eternity... for forever... for going to meet our God. This is one of the reasons why we have a tradition and strongly encourage use of the Sacrament of Reconciliation in Advent-time.



#### **RECONCILIATION AND FORGIVENESS**

One way to do some "spiritual cleaning" is to take part in the parish penance services this Advent. We have one last big time of availability coming up. **This Sunday Dec 15,** we will offer a 4:00 PM at St. Peter's in Ewing, a 5:30

PM at Rural St. John's, and a 7:00 PM at St. Theresa's in Clearwater (before the 8:00 at L Bar B!!).



We submit to God, which requires a great deal of prayer, and a willingness to be humbled—to see our strengths and weaknesses with clear eyes, so we can encourage the one or forgive the other, both in ourselves and in those around us. With Our Lady, who submitted her entire being to that of her Son, we seminarians have a model upon which to build our vocations.-Fr.Michael Duffy, Patheo


