BORN IN A BARN...NOT AS EXPECTED...

I'm definitely excited that Christmas is almost here!! We celebrate Jesus' birthday and God coming to dwell with us. Our Christmas carols celebrate the events that took place and invite our imaginations into the Christmas place in Bethlehem.

As we get closer and closer to Christmas, it's good to think about us approaching the manger... approaching God where he was born in time. Jesus wasn't born in the best rated hospital; he wasn't born into a 5-star hotel. God becoming man... Jesus being born... this is a descension or lowering of himself. God is unlimited... he is infinite. Human beings are limited... even our best can get tired, weary, and sore. Jesus' being born, being 100% God and 100% man, meant that he chose to limit himself to the dependent and helpless capacities of an infant.

THE 'SAVIOR EXPECTED' VERSUS THE 'SAVIOR NEEDED' Sometimes we can really stress ourselves about everything looking or appearing right. The Italians call that the 'bella figura' and place a high importance on it. We can have a plan... and expectations... about everything from our living room decorations to our cookie plate arrangements. There's just a way that things should be. However, Jesus's entrance isn't as we would have expected. God's plan of salvation doesn't have to meet our expectations... we just need it to work. This means that we have to discover God as he is and not as we expect him to be. He chose the hiddenness of Bethlehem to be born as a baby.

As God chooses to limit himself and to be born in time, God makes himself very vulnerable with us. Jesus, even being

the Son of God, would probably have woken his parents up in the night hungry. As he grew, Jesus' shoes would get too small and he would need bigger clothes. Jesus never stops being God, but Jesus' humanity is just as real. And because Jesus' humanity is real, Jesus doesn't understand us only from the outside. He doesn't just study about these 'humans' in a book, but Jesus can relate to our own experiences because he had real experiences like ours. As God, he knows our inmost thoughts. He can understand us the way that we want to be understood. Being human, he has his own experiential knowledge as well.

#### APPROACHING OUR GOD IN THE MANGER

Jesus was born to be our Savior. Many Christmas carols proclaim, "Christ our savior is born!" One way that we can enter into this time is to approach the manger-bed of Jesus. It is the place of God's humility... of God making himself small. We can let our own guards down and offer our God our lives... the things going well and the areas of struggle. Jesus can hold us in love and understanding.



### **CHRISTMAS CELEBRATIONS** Catholics are obliged to attend Mass twice between the evening of Friday,

December 24, and the evening of Sunday, 12/26. One of those times needs to happen before Sunday. The other of those times has to happen Saturday evening or after. Going to Mass Saturday evening can satisfy either obligation, but not both at the same time. As ever, it is the attendance at Mass that satisfies the obligation, not the specific liturgy of that Mass. \*In the chart below, the yellow boxes indicate when the first obligation may be fulfilled. The blue boxes indicate when the second obligation may be fulfilled. The content of the boxes indicates which liturgical celebration is to take place. Please note that the Saturday evening celebration, even if in fulfillment of the Sunday obligation, must be the celebration of Christmas Day and not the Holy Family.
