

The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph



TAX INCENTIVES for CHARITABLE DONATIONS

What are the federal income tax deductions for charitable contributions included in the CARES Act and how are these impacted by the Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2021?



The CARES Act made a new charitable deduction available to individual taxpayers that do not itemize their deductions. This benefit, also referred to as a universal deduction.

A Universal Donation allows for a charitable deduction for cash contributions to qualifying public charities of up to \$300 per individual. The recently enacted Consolidated Appropriation Act of 2021 further extends this benefit permitting a charitable deduction of up to \$600 on their 2021 federal income tax return for couples filing jointly. This is an above-the-line contribution that is deducted from the individual taxpayer's income prior to the calculation of their adjusted gross income. In addition to the universal deduction, the CARES Act provides incentives for both individuals and corporations by temporarily increasing the available deductions on qualified charitable contributions. The Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2021 extends these increased limits through 2021:

- Individual taxpayers who itemize their deductions can deduct 100% of their adjusted gross income on their 2021 federal income tax return. Beyond the scope of the CARES Act, as supplemented by the Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2021, the deduction for qualified charitable contributions made by itemizing individual donors is limited to 60% of their adjusted gross income.
- <u>Corporations can deduct 25% of taxable income in 2021</u>. Up from the 10% limit which is generally applicable for corporations outside of the CARES Act as supplemented by the Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2021.

Other Options (ask your tax preparer today for more information!)

- --Qualified Charitable Distributions: If a donor is 70.5 and has an IRA, a QCD is a tax-efficient way to give to charity.
- --Gifts of Appreciated Securities: The stock market enjoyed significant gains in 2021, and a gift of appreciated securities can help avoid capital gain taxes.
- --Give the gift of commodities (grain or livestock) and put yourself at a tax advantage!

2021 donations need to be <u>dated and postmarked</u> in 2021 and placed in the mail to your parish. Or, you can make the check to your parish and send to Catholic Parishes in Partnership, PO Box B, Elgin NE 68636 and we will make sure it gets to your parish. If you place in the Jan. 1-3 collection basket, please make sure it is clearly marked 2021, as all envelopes dated January 1 or later are all counted as 2022 donations.


