The old Verizon commercial used to ask, "Can you hear me now? ... Good." Sometimes we can think about talking with God like a cell phone signal... some days I have great reception and other days I have dropped calls. Prayer is not just a signal or a force, but prayer is a relationship.

PRAYER AS RELATIONSHIP

When we are asked to pray, our first reaction is often to reach into our minds for a prayer that we memorized. Prayer is a speaking to God. It encompasses those prayers that we memorize, but it is more than that. In learning a foreign language, we learn phrases to help us have a conversation. We say the prayers that we know... because we are told that this is how the prayer conversation is meant to go.

Yet one important part of prayer as a conversation is the awareness that we are not talking to the Great Unknown, but we are talking to God. A conversation with another requires the awareness of an "I – You" relationship. For example, in this column I am writing to communicate to you. In the same way, my prayer to God is "I" praying to God as "You".

If I talk to God, then I actually need to talk to him and not just about him! Look at the subtle difference of these two phrases.

About God: God is the source of joy.

To God: God, you are the source of my joy.

The first statement is a fact. The second is a truth spoken within a relationship. For me to speak to God, rather than about God, is how I can share my life... the joys and challenges... with God. It may seem like a simple distinction, but it makes all the difference.

VOCATION BECOMES A WAY OF LIFE

I've been gone these past few days to Rome for the Deacon Ordination of Zach Tucker, who will be ordained a priest for the Archdiocese of Omaha in June 2020. In one of my previous assignments, I was his associate pastor. It was a great day of celebration to see him and his classmates ordained transitional deacons at St. Peter's Basilica in Rome. These students at the Pontifical North American College are from all over the United States, Canada, and Australia. This school was also my *alma mater*, and this visit has been a renewal for my priesthood as well. As fun as this trip has been, I am very excited to be home.

Selling Grain to Benefit Your Churches:

Producers are reminded that the following needs to take place in order for you to legally remove the grain sale from

your taxable income:

- 1) The commodity is delivered to facility.
- 2) The donor signs a form (at the facility or from the parish office) that states the grain now belongs to the charity.
- 3) The facility mails the check/scale ticket to the charity. **NOTE:** Donations of grain *in the charity's name* cannot be claimed as an itemized charitable contribution so therefore will be posted as such on your end of the year contribution statement from the parish.
