

WEIGHING THE SCALES - BALANCED AND EQUAL

I usually leave the physics jokes to Fr. Vogel, so I may have to 'scale back' on the puns. There is an accusation thrown out in the Gospel parable this weekend... "You have made them equal to us..." The accusation comes from the laborers who have worked all day in the fields receiving the 'same daily wage' as those who only worked one hour. The parable outlines an indignant sense of injustice for what the landowner did.

The landowner justifies his actions as his own generosity. However, the felt injustice is something that we are meant to focus on. The landowner is an image of God. We are the image of the laborers. The time of day that we are called into the field is understood as our own personal timeline... perhaps we hear the call at the beginning of our life (as the beginning of the day), the middle of our life (during the morning hours of the day), or the end of our life (during the evening hours of the day)...

The job offer to go into the field can be understood as the Lord's invitation for us to enter into a life of faith... and a life formed by faith. Some enter into a life of faith from a young age, some in their high school, college, or adult years, and some enter into faith in their later years... with some even experiencing baptism or conversion on their deathbed.

JEALOUSY OF FAITH... AND BELIEF?

Sometimes we can make assertions and assumptions about another person's journey of faith. We can sometimes think that someone else has had an easier time than us... or should have had to work harder... or sometimes we might feel that we have be cheated or extorted instead. Why did someone who had a deathbed conversion get access to saving grace? I've had to be good my whole life, but they just had to repent at the end... it doesn't seem fair... Part of why things happen in a certain way is a mystery to us. Nevertheless, each of our lives is each of our stories of salvation. God is a prolific author and doesn't write the

same story twice. In CS Lewis's book series *The Chronicles of Narnia*, the Christ-image in the stories is Aslan the talking lion. When Aslan walks and talks with a person, he reveals them to themselves... And in conversation, one might ask about another companion's journey... Aslan's response is always the same, "No one is told any story but their own." My journey and life of faith is mine. Your journey and life of faith is yours. We hope for the same ending: salvation.

The parable is meant for us to recognize the gratuity of grace and faith. When we hear God's invitation, regardless of where we are in our lives, this is a moment of rejoicing and belonging. When we are busy judging someone else's story from the outside, we can very easily miss what God is doing inside us. We don't measure how God measures. His mercy is what brings us to salvation. If justice is 'getting what we deserve' and mercy is 'getting more than we deserve', then all of us are dependent on the mercy of God.

CHANGES TO HEALTH DIRECTIVES IN OUR LOCAL CONTEXT

Words like 'COVID' and 'unprecedented' and 'new normal' and 'upside down' and 'now more than ever...' have been used so much these past few months that their impact has grown less. All of our six parishes are in Phase IV of the Directed Health Measure (DHMs). We are given more latitude and flexibility in how we use our buildings. Gatherings in parish halls can now be 75% of normal capacity. We will be evaluating how we can best use our church spaces to provide both safety and welcome to the best of our abilities. There will be no changes to church 'worship' procedures until the first weekend in October. COVID-19 is a concern for us, but it is a concern that we acknowledge and take into consideration as we live our lives. It is important to remember that we have a type of co-responsibility in this. We have to look out for each other, especially the most vulnerable.

ANOTHER SEASON OF MINISTRY AND GRACE

As we enter into harvest-time in our fields, we are still in a beginning stage of our year of ministry. We will continue to evaluate and to adjust our time, focus, and energy to focus on our mission of making Jesus Christ known. Our pastoral context and our COVID adjustments continue to require us to reevaluate. There is only so much time, effort, and energy to spend... and we want to spend it laboring in the field of the Lord.
