love me!!! And I have experienced moments intentionally and unintentionally where I was hurt by unloving actions.

I bring this up because the Church places a strong emphasis on the family being the first place that God is experienced (The family is call the *Domestic Church—the House Church!*) and it is the building block on which all of our culture and society depends. The culture also places the family under attack... seeking to reduce and separate families into individuals.

SUBSIDIARITY IS SUPPORTING FAMILIES

The Catholic Social Teaching principle of subsidiarity identifies which level of organization is appropriate to address a challenge or difficulty. Applying subsidiarity is about trying to address a problem in a meaningful way at the most local level possible. This recognizes that a rule made at a national level may not really address the situation in my local reality. I wouldn't write a US Congressman about repaving a county road. They are not in a position to deal with that problem and appropriately resolve it.

SUBSIDIARITY AS BUILDING BLOCKS

I was looking for a lego-based meme because I always see legos as building blocks when they are not crossing-the-floor-in-the-dark obstacles. Whether you follow the lego instructions or not, you have pieces to put together and that can go together in many different ways. Subsidiarity recognizes that our human world is made up of many different building blocks. Our contemporary world is dependent on the structures that support us. Our federal government is dependent on state governments that are dependent on county governments that are dependent on city and village governments that are dependent on the communities of families and households that make up our world. Even while our American culture prioritizes the individual and individual liberty, our American society and our Catholic Church are made up of families as the organizational foundation.

FAMILIES HAVE AN 'I' AND AN 'US'

Within a family, each person has priorities, obligations, needs, aspirations, hopes, and desires. As a family experiences these, the decisions made at the family determines how we grow and go in our world. As young children, we learned what was important in our families by how we spent our time and how we celebrated life. We also learn in our families about how we respond to crisis, emergency, and tragedy. Sometimes a health care diagnosis changes how a family prioritizes life, and sometimes a quick change, accident, or loss causes us to move rapidly into heavy emotions and grief. Families give us a sense of 'together' and 'not being alone.' Families are also meant to be places where we learn and experience unconditional love.

I do also want to share a truth about my own family (and you may sense that this applies to yours as well): my family isn't perfect. My own family had its share of functions and dysfunctions... of strengths and imperfections... and when I've experienced hurt within my own family, it is amplified by the fact that they should

Parents have rights, obligations, and responsibilities in the raising of children. For example, a parent choosing how to educate his or her child has a right to choose how the child is educated. Someone could choose to partner with our Catholic schools or public schools or home school. The parent has the obligation to have the child educated. Sometimes conflict arises around the content that the school district or state desires taught in the classroom. Parents also have the right to choose how religion or faith is transmitted or passed on. In our parishes, we seek to partner with a parent's Catholic education of children through our schools and religious education programs. These programs exist to help families in this educating role, but we can never remove the parent's responsibility for faith formation. Choices we make in how we live and prioritize faith in our families is learned and heard much more loudly that anything we could say in a classroom setting.

Since we live in a world that markets directly to the consumer... directly to the individual. Our society encourages a 'permissiveness' that families have to limit and counteract. What we see, what we hear, and what we encounter impacts who we are, how we see the world, and who we become. What shows up in the media, on TV, and on the internet impacts us. History can become rewritten with an ideological lens. The meaning of love becomes warped and distorted by the presence of pornography. We have a society unwilling to answer when a human pregnancy becomes a human life. Netflix and other streaming services have shows that showcase and model aspects of the occult and witchcraft. Our world give us access to information that is beyond our normal lived experience. Parents and families have a right to choose how they experience and engage the larger world. As a Church community, we seek to help support and strengthen families in an ever-changing world. It's not easy.

Selling Grain to Benefit Your Church:



Producers are reminded that the following needs to take place in order for you to legally remove the grain sale or livestock from your taxable income:

- 1) The commodity is delivered to facility.
- 2) The donor signs a form (at the facility or from the parish office) that states the commodity now belongs to the charity.
- 3) The facility mails the check/scale ticket to the charity.

NOTE: Donations of grain *in the charity's name* cannot be claimed as an itemized charitable contribution so therefore will be posted as such on your end of the year contribution statement from the parish. Questions: Contact Michele Reicks.
