# CA Year of Hospitality

'The LORD appeared to Abraham by the oak of Mamre, as he sat in the entrance of his tent...he saw three men standing near him. When he saw them, he ran from the entrance of the tent to greet them ...He ran to the herd, picked out a tender, choice calf, and gave it to a servant, who quickly prepared it. Then he got some curds and milk, as well as the calf that had been prepared, and set these before them, waiting on them under the tree while they ate' (Genesis 18:1–8).

In this well-known passage from Genesis, we see the hospitality of Abraham. While he was in the presence of the Lord, he saw the three men and he proceeded to welcome them, feed them and wait on them....to practice hospitality....

A common definition of hospitality is 'the friendly and generous reception and entertainment of guests, visitors, or strangers.' However, hospitality is much more than a simple welcome or an offer of food or drink....hospitality is more than just being gracious and inviting guests into our homes. It's about creating an atmosphere of warmth and welcome that makes everyone feel at ease. We see this in the actions of Abraham...this is what we do in our own homes when we welcome others...this is what we want others to feel and experience. As part of our faith and tradition, hospitality is a sacred duty to provide for others' needs, whether they be physical, emotional, or spiritual. Hospitality is an *attitude of heart* that opens us to others and receives them on their own terms.

Hospitality implies *attentiveness* to others, even anticipating their needs. Jesus models that attentiveness. He noticed the sick, the excluded, the hungry, those that others passed by. Hospitality is a gift and a virtue. There is a sacredness in welcoming another into our home as Church.

In our family of parishes, we want to make 2025 a Year of Hospitality. We want to cultivate the virtue of hospitality throughout our family of parishes, to offer 'warmth and welcome', not only to members of our family of churches, but to visitors, strangers, our communities, and the wider world. Over the coming weeks, we will be reaching out to all parish ministries, to help encourage an atmosphere of 'warmth and welcome'.

Hospitality is a beautiful expression of love that strengthens relationships and builds community. In a world that can often be cold and impersonal, we need hospitality more than ever. Let us strive then, to cultivate it in our lives, our homes and in our churches and let us welcome and serve each other with open hearts and hands. To practice hospitality often leads to receiving a blessing, such occurred to Abraham and Sarah.

"Do not neglect hospitality, for through it some have unknowingly entertained angels." Hebrews 13:2

- ~ Attend a church event and take part in the fellowship: visiting with others, asking about their lives and loved ones and sharing about yours.
- ~ Have another couple or family over for a meal. This is a wonderful way to cultivate lasting friendships.
- ~ Host or lead a small group in your home or church. If God put the desire in your heart, He will bless your efforts!
- ~ Volunteer for a parish ministry (EMHC, Gift Bearer, Greeter, Lector, Sacristan, Server, Usher). It is a gift to partake in helping serve at Mass in these ways.
- $\sim$  If you are unable to fulfill your assigned ministry, ask someone to sub or switch. When we communicate and help each other out in this way, it works to build the feeling of parish life and community.


