<u>Objective of Financial Mission Appeal for</u> <u>The Diocese of Eldoret – Kenya – 2024</u>

The Diocese of Eldoret extends to the region called Kerio valley in the Great Rift valley of Kenya. The poverty level in this dry area is so high. Our request of financial appeal is meant to build some classrooms and provide pipped clean water and bathrooms for our primary school in this region of the Diocese. The Diocese of Eldoret has been serving poor people in the Kerio valley of Kenya irrespective of their faith religion since in 1960s. There is a big gap in the area of basic education especially for poor children. We began the efforts of establishing a primary school focusing on quality education for the poor children. Currently, we only have two Catholic primary schools in an area that has 3 wide parishes with 21 Mission churches. The public schools in this region are overcrowded and with gender and special disparities. Many girls are left out or have higher chances of dropping out of schools than boys due to parents using them to do more chores at home. Our schools will treat all children equally and promote a good school retention of the girl child. We aim to have at least 10% of children with disabilities coming from all over the region. We hope to combat the social exclusion of the poorest with social scholarships.



WHY VOTE FOR 434?

Launched by medical professionals, **INITIATIVE 434** will amend the Nebraska state constitution to protect babies in the second and third trimesters and keep women safe.



PROTECTS WOMEN & CHILDREN

- Babies will be constitutionally protected from abortions in the second and third trimesters.
- Nebraska's widely supported, common-sense safeguards will remain intact to protect women against unsafe, coerced abortions.

PROTECTS WHAT WE VALUE

- Initiative 434 maintains current abortion-related safety laws including informed consent, parental notification, and licensing and inspection requirements for abortion facilities.
- Legislators could provide additional protections against abortion for the safety of women, babies, and everyone involved.







WHERE DOES IT SAY THAT

in the Pro-Abortion Ballot Proposal?



REMOVES PARENTAL RIGHTS

By using "persons" instead of "women," any girl under the age of 18 could have an abortion without her parent's consent or knowledge.

FORCES TAXPAYERS TO FUND ABORTION

Abortion activists will use this language to force taxpayers to fund abortion, as they are already doing in other states.

THREATENS ALL HEALTH AND SAFETY REGULATIONS

After similar proposals passed in Michigan and Ohio, decades of common-sense health and safety laws were eliminated. This includes informed consent laws, state licensure requirements, and routine health and safety inspections.

CREATES A RIGHT TO LATE-PREGNANCY ABORTION

"Fetal viability" is defined so broadly that elective abortions will occur well into the second and third trimesters, far beyond Nebraska's current law allowing abortions only through the first trimester and in cases of rape, incest, or to save the mother's life.

ALLOWS ABORTION CLINIC EMPLOYEES TO DECIDE VIABILITY

This vague and undefined language will result in non-doctors, including abortion clinic employees, having the sole discretion to decide if a baby is "viable" and can be aborted.

PUTS VULNERABLE BABIES AT RISK

Babies born at 32-36 weeks and even later often need the help of medical equipment to breathe—one example of an "extraordinary medical measure." Under this ballot proposal, these babies are not "viable" and will be aborted.

ARTICLE I, SECTION 31

THE NEBRASKA STATE CONSTITUTION
WOULD BE AMENDED TO READ...

"All persons shall have a fundamental right to abortion until fetal viability, or when needed to protect the life or health of the pregnant patient, without interference from the state or its political subdivisions.

Fetal viability means the point in pregnancy when, in the professional judgment of the patient's treating health care practitioner, there is a significant likelihood of the fetus' sustained survival outside the uterus without the application of extraordinary medical measures."
